

## **Cedar Lakes Guest Guide**

### **Check out**

Check out time is 12noon. If you have arranged a late check out, we ask that you vacate the cottage no later than **4 pm**. Sorry, but we cannot accommodate same-day requests for late checkouts. Prior to departure, we ask that you please:

- Clean any dirty dishes
- Remove all food from the refrigerator
- Leave the key on the kitchen counter and the door unlocked

### **Garbage**

The cleaning staff will remove garbage at the end of your stay. If you need to empty your garbage during your stay there is a dumpster located to the right of the red maintenance garage which is located at the top of the hill when you first enter the property.

### **The Grounds**

You will find a map of the property in this folder. The property is 500 acres in total. Please respect the restrictions outlined below when camp is in session, otherwise you are free to explore (please do not enter any buildings). The old Greenville Turnpike (the "toll road") is about 1.5 miles long and great for walking, biking or cross-country skiing. There is also a trail that leads around the upper lake.

### **The Lake**

We hope you enjoy our twin cedar lakes. Rowboats for your use are located on the dock near the Lakeside cabin. Fishing is catch and release and does not require a license. The lake has Large Mouth Bass, Crappie, Blue Gill, Catfish, Perch and Sunfish.

Swimming is permitted anywhere on either of the lakes, but the best spot is the beachfront area on the upper lake. When campers are in residence during the summer (Mon at 8am until Friday at 5pm), we ask that cottage guests use the lower lake only. Please enjoy the lake safely.

### **Summer Camp Property Restrictions**

From late June until mid-August a summer camp operates on part of the property. Cottage guests are not permitted to enter the camp area when

campers are in residence (Mon at 8am until Friday at 5pm). When campers are not present, cottage guests are free to use the tennis and basketball courts on the camp property. Guests can use the upper lake whenever campers are not in residence.

**For your safety please do not use the ropes course, zipline, or the waterfront recreation equipment at any time. We also ask that you not enter any of the camp buildings.**

#### **Farmer's Market:**

The farmer's market in downtown Port Jervis is held on Saturdays 8am to 2pm from June 28<sup>th</sup>-October 25<sup>th</sup>. It is located in the municipal lot between Front and Ball Streets.

## **Nearby Activities and Points of Interest**

### **Highpoint State Park**

Highpoint S.P. is only a few miles away and offers hiking/mtn.biking trails, swimming, and fishing. In the winter they have exceptional cross-country skiing. Don't miss the great view from Highpoint Monument.

Directions:

1. At exit of property turn right onto Old Mountain Rd
2. Turn right at County Rte-55/Mountain Rd/Greenville Rd
3. Continue to follow Mountain Rd, entering New Jersey (~3.6 mi)
4. Turn right at NJ-23 and continue about a mile to the park entrance

### **Port Jervis:**

One exit away on Route 84 West. Port Jervis has a growing arts community and is also home to some great antique shops and historic points of interest. There are several galleries and seven antique shops on Front Street in downtown.

The northern entrance to the park is about 15 miles away.

To get there:

1. Take I-84 W (1.9 mi)

2. Take exit 53 for US-6/US-209 toward Matamoras (0.3 mi)
3. Keep left at the fork, follow signs for Milford (161 ft)
4. Turn left at Pennsylvania Ave/US-209/US-6 , continue to follow US-209/US-5 (5.7 mi)
6. Turn left at E Harford St/US-209  
Park Entrance will be on the right

1. Take 84 East to exit 3E to merge onto NY-17M/Rte-17M/State Route 17M/US-6 toward Goshen (4.9 mi)
2. Take the ramp onto US-6 E (12.8 mi)
3. Continue on NY-17 E (0.5 mi)
4. Take exit 131 for NY-17/NY-32 toward Newburgh/Suffern (0.2 mi)
5. Turn left at NY-17 (0.1 mi)
6. Continue on NY-32/Rte-32/State Route 32 (0.2 mi)
7. Turn right at Woodbury Outlets Blvd N (256 ft)
